GATHER MATERIALS

- Watch the author, <u>Hanoch Piven</u>, as he creates a face with different objects.

CREATE & SHARE

- Using your collection of Beautiful Stuff, make your face.
 Think about why you are choosing certain materials for different parts of yourself. Make another face and describe it (for example, "your silly face"). How many different faces can you make?
- Share your creations with someone and describe the details of each face you made before you return your materials to your collection. Take a photo if you want to remember them.

GO BEYOND...

- Listen to <u>Faces</u> and notice the different materials used to make them.
- On a piece of paper, write one or two sentences that tell about you or get ideas from the book, My Best friend is as Sharp as a Pencil and write a simile. Use the sentence frame, "I am as _____ as a _____".
- Create faces of your friends and family using your collection of *Beautiful Stuff* or use other materials such as paint or plasticine.
