Kindergarten – Life Cycles

Lesson Instructions for Parents/Guardians


Know – What do I already know about life cycles?

To start this lesson, discuss aging – what happens to us when we get older? How is a baby different from a child? How is a child different from an adult?

Explain that all living things go through different stages in their lives.

Example: Life Cycle of a Butterfly

With your child, look at the image of a butterfly's life cycle. Point to each stage and say its name.





<u>Do – Explore to learn more about Life Cycles</u>

Watch this video from SciShow Kids about how a caterpillar becomes a butterfly.

While you are watching, pay to:

- The 4 stages of their life what is this called?
- What happens during each stage?

Next, read this National Geographic Kids article about Monarch Butterflies.

Talk about the reasons why Monarch butterflies migrate. How is this part of their lifecycle?

Understand – Put together what I have learned to further my knowledge of Life <u>Cycles</u>

Help your child to illustrate their own life cycle diagram using the handout on the next page. Ask:

- What is the first stage of a butterfly life cycle?
 - Egg

Next, draw the egg stage of the life cycle – be sure to include a nice green leaf



Ask:

What have you learned about the egg stage?

Follow the same steps for stages 2, 3 and 4 of the butterfly life cycle.
