


Ricky's and Vicki's Adventures

# GATHER MATERIALS

- Sticks, a variety of sizes and lengths
- String or embroidery or other coloured thread
- Materials from your Beautiful Stuff collection (optional)

# READ ALONG & THINK

- READ along with the illustrator Axel Scheffler as he shares his book <u>Stick Man</u>
- THINK about Stick Man's adventures and how he tried to return to his family tree.
- VIEW other Stick Man adventures <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>.
- What other adventures could you imagine Stick Man having?

### CREATE & SHARE

- MAKE your own stick people <u>here</u> or <u>here</u> and read about their adventures with Ms. Roz from Forest Grove's StrongStart and with Ms. Gael from Chaffey-Burke's StrongStart.
- PLAY with your stick people. What kind of adventures do they have? What are their names? Where does their adventure take place? What happens?
- TELL someone your story.

- Use your imagination. How many ideas can you come up with? Maybe you'll have enough to make a whole book!
- Tell your story or share your book with someone or even with your pet!
