Prepositions show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and some other elements in a sentence.


Prepositions are one of the harder parts of speech to grasp! So don't feel discouraged if you don't understand right away

Prepositions <u>usually</u> describe the position of something, the time when something happens and the way in which something is done.

Here are some examples:

- 1. Sophie leaned against the wall. → The position of something
- 2. Sophie hid during hide-and-seek.

 The time when something happens
- 3. Sophie swam without her goggles this summer. → The way in which something is done
