Activity 1: Using a 10 Frame

Materials Needed:

• Any small objects around the house that can be counted—toys, beans, crackers, rocks.

Task Instructions:

Building on the Counting to 10 activities, have children use the 10 frame b to arrange their collection. For each number, have them explore the different ways the objects can be arranged. For example, 7 objects can be arranged in a full row of 5 then 2 below; or 4 then 3.... If you don't have a printer, you can make a 10 frame out of popsicle sticks or just draw one!

Ask questions after the child has counted:

- -How many did you have?
- -Did you get the same number if you arrange them in a different way in the 10-frame?
- -How many more to you need to fill the ten frame?
- -If your child is ready, you can discuss the concept of odd and even numbers.
