
## ELEPHANT AND PIGGIE! BOOKMAKING PROJECT- PART 2

## GATHER MATERIALS

- Paper and stapler to make your book or use one of your pre made books
- Writing and drawing tools (pen, pencil, crayons, felts, etc)
- An Alphabet chart

## CREATE & SHARE

- CHOOSE the size and shape of the book you want to make.
- BEGIN CREATING your own Elephant and Piggie book. On each page make a drawing of Gerald and Piggie and also a "word bubble" like in We Are In A Book
- WRITE in the bubbles to show what Gerald and Piggie are feeling or saying.
- Having an alphabet chart nearby can also help. Say the word you want to write out loud and try and print the letters of the sounds you hear.
- TELL about your book along the way and SHARE it with others when you finish.
