
MO WILLEMS-ILLUSTRATOR SPOTLIGHT

WRITE AND DRAW EVERYDAY!

Remember to use your Writer's Notebook daily to record:

- ideas for stories or non-fiction
- drawings and descriptions of characters or topics
- words you've collected that you find interesting
- beginning or endings you like
- wonderings...do you have a question for the author?

GATHER MATERIALS

- Your Writerr's Notebook or piece of paper
- A pencil and eraser

READ, THINK, RESPOND

- Hear <u>Mo Willems</u> talk about how he uses his writer's notebook to grow his ideas and plan out the story for his book Waiting is Not Easy.

GO BEYOND

Listen to a group of 7 year olds reading <u>Can I Play</u> <u>Too?</u>
