

HUNTING FOR ALLITERATIONS!


LISTENING FOR THE SAME SOUNDS AT THE BEGINNING OF WORDS

Using language in creative and playful ways helps us understand how language works. Listening and speaking builds our understanding and helps us to learn.









GATHER MATERIALS

- Paper
- Writing tool pen, pencil, felt, sharpie, etc.

LISTEN AND THINK

Let's go on an alliteration hunt with the following books. Listen for the same sounds at the beginning of words.

- Some Smug Slug
- The North American Animal ABC's
- Animalia
- Let's go on another alliteration hunt with Canadian author Jessica Young. As she reads pages from her book, My Blue Is Happy, see if you can hear her say the same sounds at the beginning of words such as "cozy as a curled up kitten."

CREATE & SHARE

- Choose a colour and draw a picture of what that colour means to you. How does it make you feel? Is YOUR red angry like a dragon's breath or brave like a fire truck?
- Write the beginning letter of your colour and don't forget to write your name, too!
