Brainstorm Story Ideas

You should now have an idea what you want your story to be about. You don't need all the details yet, but have a starting point.

It is time to Brainstorm!

<u>Brainstorming</u> is a tool writers use to come up with ideas. There are 3 ways of brainstorming that you will explore for your creative writing story.

- 1. Free Write
- 2. Making a List
- 3. Mind Mapping

Free Writing

A free write is writing with no stopping! It's a good way to get all your ideas out. Don't worry about how it looks – just keep moving the pencil on the paper. One way to get started is to set a timer for five to ten minutes and just start writing ideas. Have your topic in mind and keep your words flowing. Don't worry about spelling or grammar; the goal is to get as many ideas as possible down. If you can't think of what to write, just write anything that comes to mind.

More Brainstorming Ideas

More ways to brainstorm...

Making a List

Write down your topic as the title. Then list as many related ideas underneath it. Write phrases or single words. Your list when brainstorming does not have to be in any kind of order – just list as many things as you can about the topic.

Mind Mapping

Put your story idea in a circle in the middle of the page. Then create branches off it and write down ideas. From these bigger branches, draw smaller branches with related ideas. You can use different colours and add images (quick sketches) to help you with the process.
