Lesson Focus: The world is made of a variety of landforms that impacts people.

Materials:

- Internet access for videos
- Materials to build your landforms (they can be as simple as blankets and chairs or use modeling clay or Lego)
- Camera to take a picture

Invitation to Learn:

In this lesson you will learn there are a variety of landforms in the world.

Ask:

- Name 3 oceans in the world.
- List 3 characteristics that describe mountains.
- How are mountains formed?
- Can you name a mountain close to where you live?
- The Fraser River is an estuary. What feature makes it an estuary? (Hint: check the video on Exploring Landforms and Bodies of Water for Kids)

Notebook Time:

Time to build.

You can use whatever is available to you to create landforms. When you are finished, take a picture of it and name or label the landforms. Make sure you include the following:

- mountain
- valley
- Island
- plains (flat lowland)
- lake
- river
- beach
