

I LOST MY TOOTH

GATHER MATERIALS

- One of your pre made books or some stapled sheets of paper
- Writing and drawing tools
- Alphabet chart

LISTEN AND THINK

Read along with <u>I Lost My Tooth</u> An Unlimited Squirrels Adventure by Mo Willems. Think about a time when you lost one of your teeth. How did it happen? How did you feel? When do you predict you might lose your next tooth?

CREATE & SHARE

Create your own "Big Story" about:

- losing your own tooth or
- another version of what happened to zoom squirrel's tooth.

Use speech bubbles like Mo Willems. He also likes to write VERY LARGE sized words to show excitement or to show the characters using a louder voice. You might want to try that too! Remember to write the letters of the sounds you hear and use your alphabet chart to help you.

- Share your story with someone.
