

Since at least the 1970s, forestry practices in Canada have improved dramatically; those who harvest timber on Crown lands follow some of the strictest environmental standards in the world.

In the 21st Century, Canada's forest industry suffered from a new set of challenges that resulted in a long list of mill closures and lost jobs. However, as you can see in the graph created with 2013 data below, Canada is still a leading supplier of wood and wood products globally.
